INTERNSHIP AT ZION!

The ordination of Pastor Rachel was a wonderful celebration of the ministry we have been sharing with the church to raise up new rostered leaders. We were blessed to have Rachel as our Intern and then a Student Pastor for about 15 months. Zion did a great job supporting her in this journey, for the sake of the Gospel witness.

For the 2026-2027 school year, Zion will be applying for an Intern again, from Wartburg Theological Seminary. We are able to do this because there is a new ELCA Fund For Leaders grant that the seminary will receive that can be allocated toward the Internship site expenses, up to \$25,000. We would also apply for the Northern Illinois Synod grant for internship as well, which would cover the cost of interns. The conversation I had with Wartburg in December helped me to see that they value the diversity of our ministry and expansive partnerships we have created at and beyond Zion.

The congregation has been richly blessed by the many different and unique seminarians from the past. I have been blessed by the gifts and talents of seminarians who bring a broader approach to ministry, along with the resources of seminaries in this century. As I have become a seasoned pastor (another way for saying older), these new approaches and ideas have kept me on my toes theologically and intellectually. I am grateful that we can at least apply, even if we are not assigned due to the limited number of candidates. We will find out in the spring if a seminarian would be assigned.

I believe we are called to continue to serve with the neighbors of Rockford with an amazing outreach focus rooted in our Sunday morning worship where we are fed by the word, a meal and a growing community of friends in faith. This foundation is the way we are sustained for the call to serve.

Hello everyone! January is Mental Wellness Month. The holiday season can be a very stressful and difficult time for many people, especially those that have experienced the loss of a loved one this time of year or are experiencing health challenges. Your mental health directly affects your physical and emotional well-being, so it is important you're taking care of yourselves and remembering to take time for yourself during this season.



Self-care is different for everyone, but here are some ways you can practice self-care:

- Exercise even if it's brief. This could be as simple as cleaning up spaces in your home or putting up decorations. Any movement is better than no movement. Come to my class Tuesdays and Thursdays from 9-10am at St. Bridget's Catholic Church! It is located in their Parish Hall, Classroom A. Please text or call me if you want more information!
- Reading can provide a sense of relaxation and entertainment, especially on a cold wintry day
- Meditation, prayer, and mindfulness can calm the mind, especially after a busy day of hosting holiday activities
- Practicing gratitude Life can become very busy and overwhelming, especially this time of year, so it's important to take a few moments each day to share what you're grateful for whether you write it down in a journal or share during friendly conversations take a moment to be present with yourself and others
- Journaling can be beneficial, especially if you've had a busy day. Take a few moments to reflect on your day and everything you've accomplished
- Getting enough rest Sleep gives our bodies the opportunity to recover from the activities of the day, refreshes our mind for the next day, and gives us a break from stress or challenges we may be facing. 8 hours of sleep is ideal for full physical rest and recovery
- Being creative, whether you like to paint, draw, color, sew, crochet, knit, do holiday or DIY crafts, bake or cook a new recipe, journal, etc. The opportunities to express yourself and creativity are endless, and may bring joy to others
- Maintaining physical hygiene showering, getting a haircut, getting a manicure or pedicure, doing your makeup, applying deodorant or perfume/cologne, applying lotion to dry skin or chap stick to dry lips, keeping your eyeglasses clean, etc. are all ways to maintain your physical hygiene. These tasks may seem simple, but for people that are experiencing depression, may take a lot of energy, physically and mentally
