### FIRST READING Acts 2:1-21

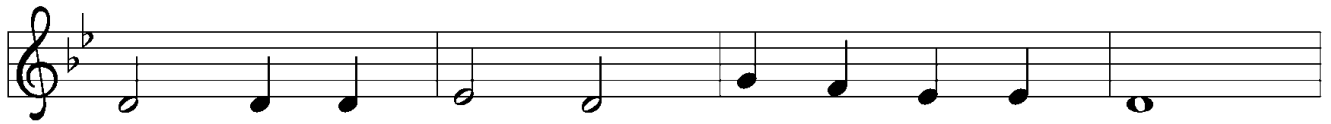

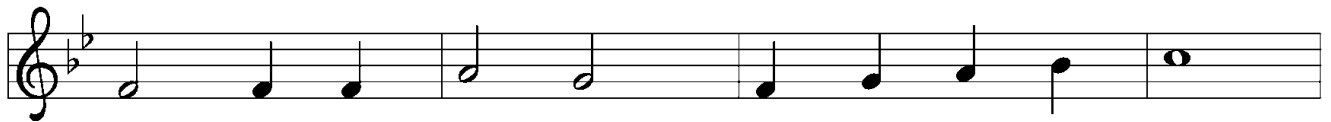

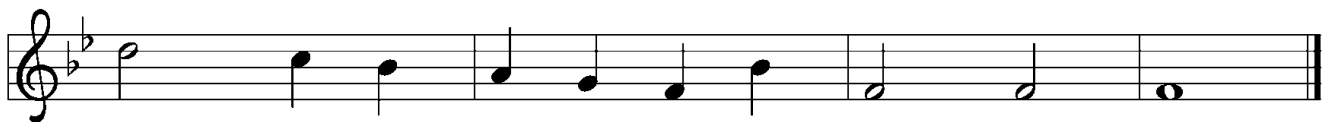

APOSTLES' CREED


