

Have you noticed that the older you get the faster time flies? This summer is no exception and has flown by. Many of us have enjoyed being outside and having family and friends over for a cookout with plenty of food for everyone. However, hundreds of families in the Rockford area have not been as fortunate. These families suffer from food insecurity and don't know where their next meal is coming from. The Cornucopia Food

Pantry serves about 105 families twice a week. Even though the pandemic is officially over the need keeps growing. Inflation has hit the pantry as it has most of us. Unfortunately, as the cost of food has increased the monetary donations have decreased. For example, in April expenses doubled and some food items were unavailable. Cornucopia is very thankful for the support they receive from Zion and the people of Rockford. But the pantry needs more help. Each month WOZ has been collecting nonperishable foods. In August it was canned fruits and in September WOZ will be collecting cereal for donation. Please bring your cereal to the shopping cart in the narthex or directly to Jolyn's office.
