# BAPTISM AT ZION

Baptism is a gift of God's grace to children and adults. You are welcome to join us and celebrate this gift for yourself and/or your child in the Christian faith. Please contact the church office or talk with Pastor about arranging for a Baptism at worship. Please pray and consider joining us in faith through the water and the words of promise made by God upon our lives. We remember that the mission of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America's mission statement is: "Marked with the cross of Christ forever, we are claimed, gathered, and sent for the sake of the world."

Baptism is a source of identity! Developmental psychologists say that shame is developed early on in the life of the child. I don't need to find myself, God has already found me in my Baptism and accepts and approves me. I belong to the body of Christ. Your identity is not rooted in what others say about you or about what you think about yourself. "I have called you by name and you are mine." — Isaiah!



Baptism is held in the context of the community because your identity is then rooted in your identity with God's people and not on your own. Baptism is a sacrament of inclusion. The greatest distance in the world is the 18 inches between your head and your heart and Baptism is rooted in connecting the two. You do not find your identity, you are found by God in your Baptism. God finds you in your Baptism and in the community of people called the church.

All of life is sacred and a gift. There are many physical elements in life that are sacred and filled with the grace of God. Human relationships are sacred to us. We have very sacred personal connections with one another that are very special and holy.

What makes Baptism a sacrament is that it has three characteristics. These three characteristics make up the two sacraments in the Lutheran Church, Baptism and Holy Communion.

- 1. Gift of God's Grace!
- 2. Physical Element Attached!
- 3. Commanded by Jesus!

The Gift of God's Grace in Baptism is that we are adopted into God's family. The Physical Elements attached in Baptism is the water and Word. Baptism was commanded by Christ when he told the disciples to baptize.

**PARENTS AND BAPTISM** - Parents have the greatest influence on the faith of the child. Any parent who desires to have their child Baptized into the Christian faith is invited to call the office to make arrangements. We encourage parents to attend worship at least for one month before a Baptism is scheduled & attend a Baptism class. Please talk with Pastor about a date for Baptism. We want to help you support the spiritual formation of your child.

**AFFIRMATION OF BAPTISM** - Parents make a commitment to raise their baptized child in the Christian community in Baptism. We trust that the Holy Spirit will lead that child to a point in their life when they will want to affirm the gift of grace in Christ as their Lord and Savior. We encourage all Christians daily to reaffirm that gift of grace and walk in their Baptism as children of God. We daily give up control and allow the Holy Spirit to lead our lives as disciples of Christ.

**BAPTISM SPONSORS** - The role of the Baptismal Sponsor is to support the parents in laying down a Biblical foundation in the life of the child. This takes place not just on the day of the Baptism. The Sponsor promises to help with the Spiritual development of the child until adulthood. The Baptismal Sponsor is encouraged to participate in the life of the child by remembering the day of the Baptism every year. Sponsors are encouraged to give their God-child a gift on the anniversary of the Baptism that will help the child learn more about Jesus. The average toy is to be avoided, as most other friends and family members will purchase these items. Consider buying videos (*Veggie Tales, Davie and Goliath*, etc.) or age—appropriate music (refer to local Christian book store) or age-related Bibles. These items will continue to encourage the child to develop a relationship with Jesus as they get older.

- 3) **Blessing:** Close by marking one another with a cross on the forehead and say: "(Name), child of God, always remember that God loves you and so do I."
