Finally, I'm grateful that I have the freedom and privilege to participate in all of these things, as well as life at Zion in general. It is truly a blessing to live and learn here, and I'm so incredibly thankful that the Spirit keeps calling me to places where God's grace and mercy are shared abundantly. Every time I see the Spirit of freedom present in this community, even in simple things like the breaking of doughnuts and in the drinking of coffee, I praise God that in Christ we are freed from the power of sin and death and freed for service to God and to our neighbor.

BIBLE STUDY—Wednesday Morning Bible Study at Stockholm Inn, 8:00AM, feel free to join the group ZION MULTICULTURAL TEAM is asking the Zion congregation to join them in participating in this towel drive in memory of Charmaine Logwood, a Zion member, former social worker at Jubilee Center who passed in October, 2022. What we still need for reopening the showers are white towels (so they can be bleached). Specifically large towels, like a beach towel HOMELESSTRAINING.COM As a member of the Missions Team, I volunteered to watch a one hour free video on Homeless Training. I have a personal interest in this subject as I have someone I love very much who is experiencing homelessness and addiction. I highly recommend that others commit to watching this video instructed by Ryan Dowd, who has worked many years in a Homeless Shelter and teaches many of these classes. Homeless people experience a great deal more physical and sexual trauma than any of us could even imagine. If not as children or youth, but also being homeless and living on the streets, a very unsafe environment in which to try and exist. When people experience high levels of trauma, it alters the areas of their brains that house decision making, abstract thinking and regulates their moods. Trauma changes how the brain works and the trajectory of their life. This training teaches about how to relate to them with compassion, know their names. speaking calmly, making eye contact, shaking their hands. Greeting them in the same way you would greet another human being. Ryan gives us ideas for diffusing conflict without having to call the police. He teaches how we can lead a person into the kind of behavior we want from them by modeling appropriate behavior. Body language is a great tool to help diffuse a situation or to encourage a positive encounter. Homeless people already have a very battered self esteem. Kindness goes a long way. To loosely paraphrase the Bible verse Ist Corinthians 15:10 "Yet but for the grace of God I go." **Bonnie Dahlberg**
